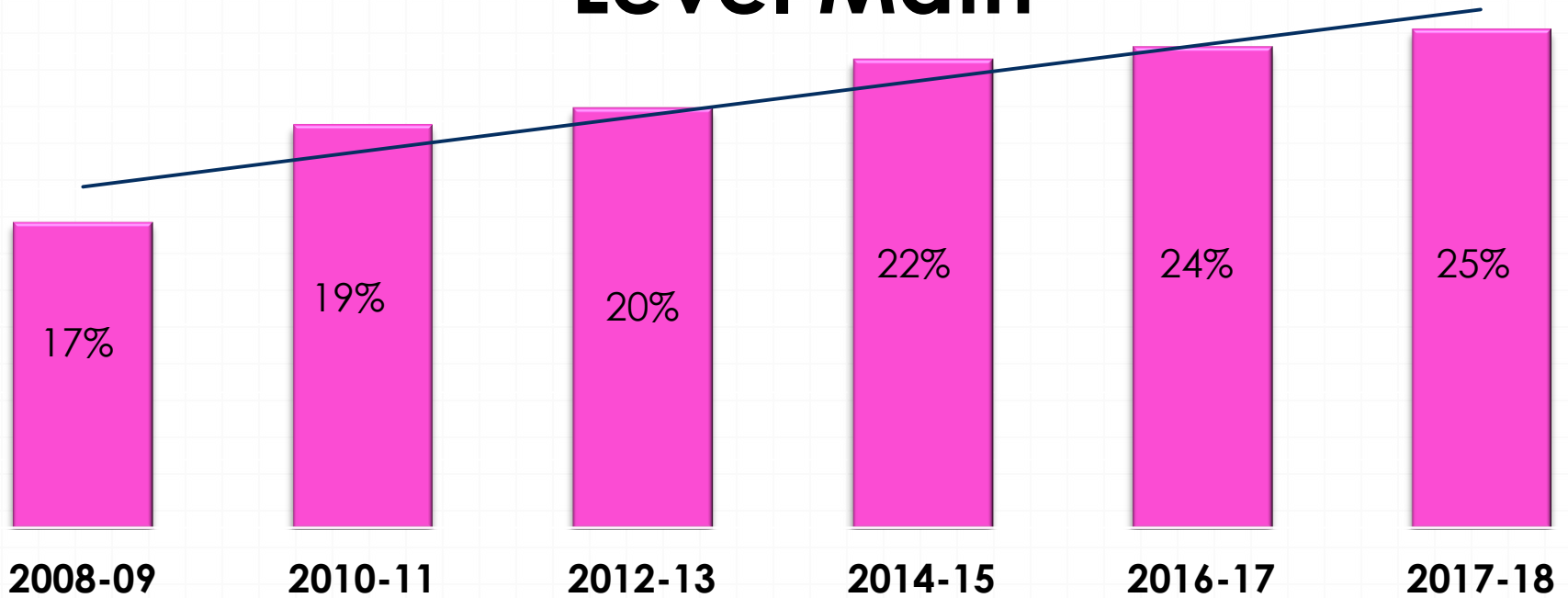

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Dev Ed Redesign and Multiple Measures

- o NC completed a developmental education redesign in 2013
 - o Developmental math modules
 - o Integrated reading and writing compressed courses
- o High School GPA placement – Multiple Measures was introduced in 2015
 - o 2.6 GPA = college ready for gateway math and English

Students Attempting College Level Math



RISE in Brief

- Placing students into one of three pathways based primarily on their HS GPA
- Replacing prerequisite remediation with co-requisite remediation
- Increasing the number of students that successfully pass a gateway math and English within two years

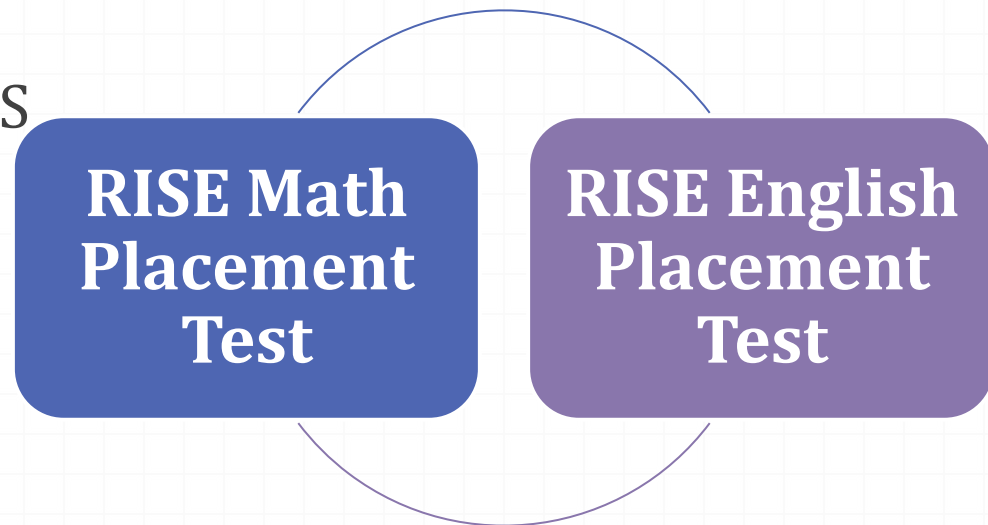

RISE Placement Test

- Students are not permitted to test if they are within 10 years of HS graduation and have valid GPA
- Complete assessment may take up to 5 hours

Advising Students

- o Check HS GPA and place accordingly
- o To determine if higher placement is possible
 - o Check for DMA or DRE credit
 - o Check for ACT/SAT or other test placement
 - o Check for MAT 003 or ENG 002 credit
 - o Check for Associate or Bachelor degree

Another State Initiative

- o College and Career Ready Graduates (CCRG)
 - o State legislation requiring community colleges to
 - o Provide remediation in high school for students who are deemed not college and career ready
 - o Determine what students will take the courses
 - o Provide the courses

RISE and CCRG

- o RISE placement will now be used in high school for CCRG placement
 - o 2.2-2.799 unweighted GPA as a junior = CCRG courses as a senior
 - o RISE Transition Courses will be the basis of curriculum for CCRG courses
- o Students who earn mastery level grades in CCRG will be deemed college ready at the community college
 - o CCRG grade of A = GPA 2.8+

Career and College Promise

- o High school students who are dual enrolled in college courses
- o RISE placement will be used to inform CCP eligibility
 - o If placement test is required, RISE Placement Test will be used
 - o High school students will be able to take co-requisite courses
